Position Summary:

This position is responsible for providing leadership to WisDOT's transportation system planning program. This program addresses extremely complex interrelationships between economic development, air pollution, land use, and transportation facilities and services and among modes of transportation and includes the development of multi-mode transportation system plans, highway corridor plans, and modal specific plans. This position manages professional staff and private consultants.

Additional responsibilities include:

- Developing major corridors throughout the state including strategies to improve alternative transportation services, demand management strategies, as well as identifying the need for major highway expansions
- Developing system plans for major transit services statewide, which address emerging transportation modes such as commuter rail, Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) and light rail transit, and addresses concerns of urban sprawl, air and water pollution, transit services, community development, neighborhood disruption and economic goals
- Providing recommendations regarding urban transportation issues, priorities, facility and service improvements, and funding
- Developing statewide modal specific plans, such as highways, airports, urban transit systems, bicycle and pedestrian plans
- Providing support and advice to the WisDOT, the Governor's office, the Legislature, and other governmental officials in matters related to urban transportation
